

History command

by default returns an history of latest command ran on this login
it is ~the latest "HISTSIZ" commands. it can differ with the options of HISTCONTROL (for example ignoredups which ignore duplicates)

remove the number

```
history | cut -d ' ' -f 4-
```

depending on the setup you might change 4 by 5/6 ... Reference:

Avoid registering a command

When you pass some arguments like passwords, you can skip the registration of the command by adding a space before the command

```
command -pass XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX
```
